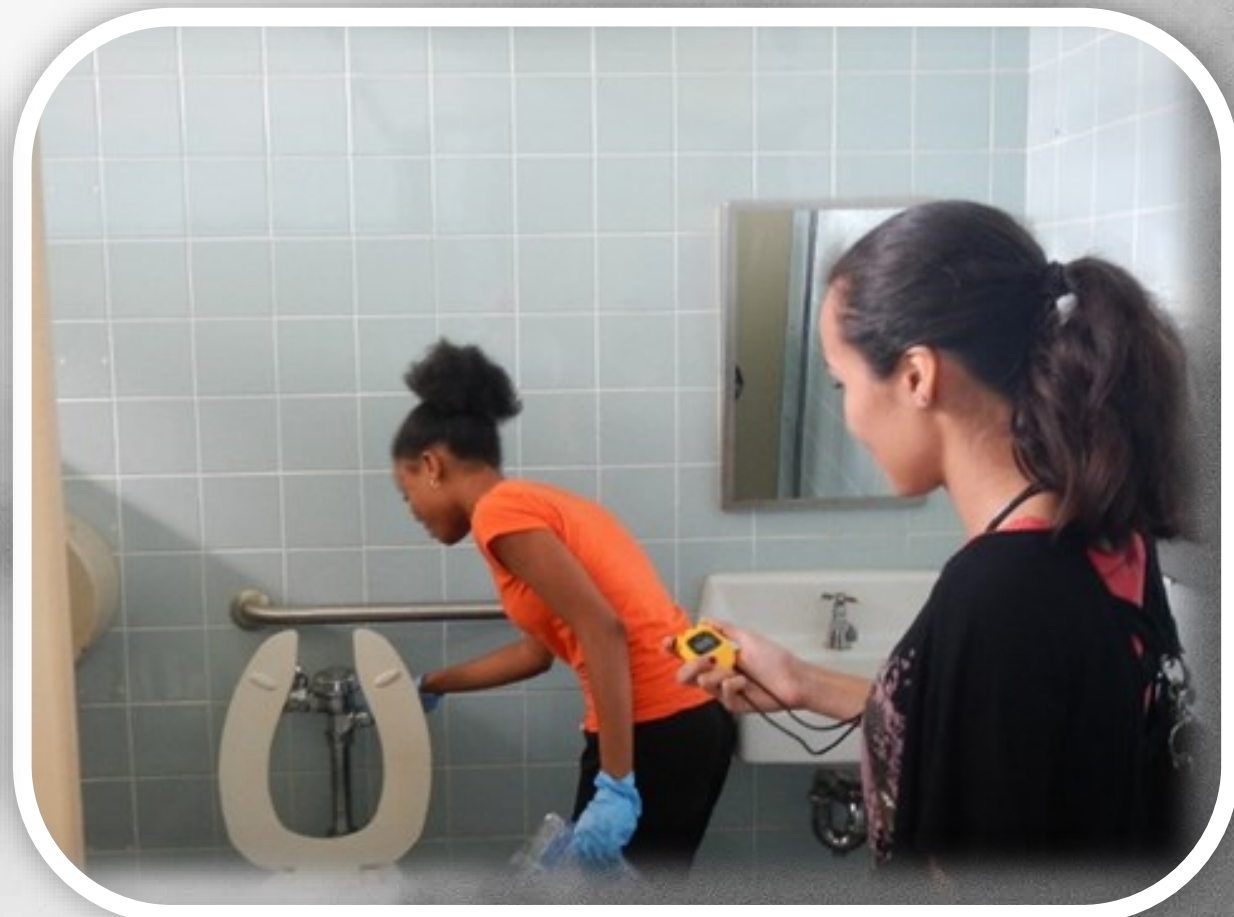

NatureScape Broward School Partnership began after the impact of Hurricane Wilma was felt across Broward County. The School Partnership began in 2007.

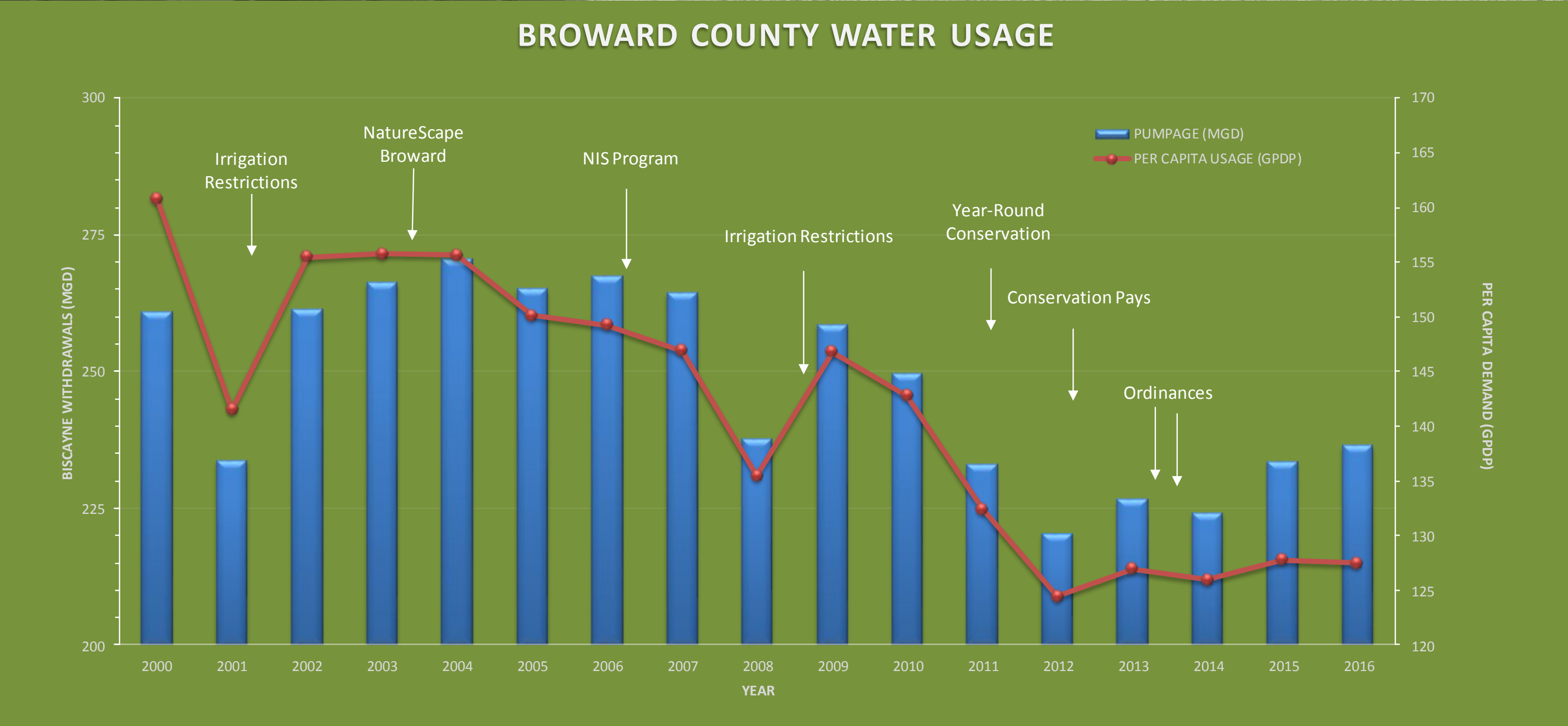
In 2009, the Partnership began to address water conservation on school grounds, adding a Water Conservation Specialist, increasing the total FTE's in the Partnership to 2.5.



Water Conservation At A Glance:

Irrigation evaluations, installation of soil sensors and smart controllers, indoor water audits and retrofits, and facilities personnel trainings on outdoor and indoor water conservation techniques.

Summary

Since 2009, 588 irrigation evaluations at 268 schools have received irrigation evaluations resulting in annual savings of \$773,501 and over 382 million gallons per year.

17 schools have received water audits, with identified potential annual savings of \$487,000 and savings of over 20 million gallons per year.
