
Conservation Considerations



Why Turf?



- 60% of Potable Water = Outdoor
- Up to 50% Wasted
- Irrigation Run-off Lost/Untreated



Landscape Restrictions



- No new turf installation in front yards or at commercial properties
- Turf in back yards limited to 50% coverage
- Replacement of turf with water-efficient landscaping cannot be prohibited

SNWA Water Smart Landscapes Program



- Reduce water consumption by 50-70 gallons per square foot converted
- Cash rebate per square foot
- Beneficial landscaping requirements

Barriers to Participation



- Up to 30% of applicants withdraw due to upfront expenses
- Up-front cost: \$2-\$5 per square foot
- Rebate received at project completion

Result: Inferior quality or cancelled projects

 HELP: Low-income landscape renovations




