



Deliverables- Actual results



- Energy Conservation The Royal York Hotel in Toronto, Ontario purchased and installed energy-efficient equipment during replacements and renovations, with expected savings of \$28,000 per year.
- Energy and Water Conservation The Holiday Inn Harbourview in Halifax, Nova Scotia saves \$65,000 per year through energy conservation practices and over \$30,000 per year through water efficiency practices.
- General Environmental BMPs Through implementation of comprehensive environmental Best Management Practices and other projects, Treesdale Golf and Country Club in Pennsylvania earned a \$27,000 per year property tax credit, received lowered insurance premiums, and reduced overall operating costs.
- Environmental Restoration The Club at Carlton Woods converted a five-acre waste bunker on its golf course into an attractive wetland habitat. The project had a less than 15 year payback period calculated based on avoided maintenance of waste bunker alone (more than \$5,500 per year and 20 manhours per month). In addition, the three residential lots facing the area, which were not selling, suddenly all sold for higher-than-expected value, bringing in a premium of more than \$300,000.



Williamston, NC

- Passed water conservation ordinance and implemented incentive program for homeowner rebates and retrofits for lowflow fixtures
- Obtained more than \$30,000 in grant money to fund demonstration projects at Williamston High School (rainwater capture, graywater reuse, groundwater recharge, biofilters, native plant landscaping, permeable pavement)
- Adopted environmentally-responsible management practices and policies on Town-owned land Williamston2020
- Completed Treasuring Home Survey
- 20 Individual Case Studies for projects completed have been compiled
