




Since January, 2009

- Stimulus funding for green project reserve
- New Executive Order
- Climate change bills
- Water efficiency in **30** pending House and Senate Bills
- Even the Senate Majority Leader filed 2 water efficiency bills!
- \$ for water efficiency for the first time, although very modest compared with energy

ARRA

AWE Green Jobs Analysis (2008)

- \$10 Billion yields 150,000-220,000 jobs
- Economic Benefit multiplier of 1.3 to 1.5


Stimulus Package Funding (2009)

- \$787 Billion overall
- \$6 Billion for water and wastewater
- 20% "green project" set-aside
- 20% must be for water efficiency, energy efficiency, and storm water management



New Executive Order

- Signed October 5, 2009
- Sets sustainability goals for federal agencies
- Requires a "Senior Sustainability Officer" in every agency to be held accountable to CEQ Chair and OMB Director
- Requires 2020 greenhouse gas emissions reduction target set within 90 days
- WATER EFFICIENCY: 26% reduction in water use required by 2020 (2% annually)





WaterSense

- Congressional authorization needed for separate budgeting
- Current EPA funding: \$2.5 million per year
- Congressional Hearing March 30, 2009
- New annual funding levels proposed:
 - S. 1005: \$5 million in 2010, to max of \$10 million by 2014
 - S. 1712, H.R. 2368: \$7.5 million in 2010, to max of \$50 million in 2013




Water Efficiency Research

- EPA Office of Research and Development not historically interested in water efficiency
- Specific congressional mandate
- H.R. 631 passed in early 2009
 - \$100 million over 5 years
- Senate version is in Section 302 of S.1005
 - \$200 million over 5 years
 - Not all the money is for water efficiency



Tax Credits and Bonds Reid Bill S. 1711

- 50% tax credit (up to \$750 max) for WaterSense products, or landscaping reducing water use by 50%
- \$1,500 contractor tax credit for each WaterSense New Home
- Adding "water" to \$4 billion in energy conservation bonds:
 - 30% reduction in public facilities
 - Advanced AMR and billing
 - Reducing water loss



Commercial Facility Retrofit

Alliance

Water Efficiency

- REEP Retrofit for Energy and Environmental Performance
- \$24 per 1,000 gallons/year of potable water savings of 40% or more;
- \$27 per 1,000 gallons/year of potable water savings of 50% or more
- \$30 per 1,000 gallons/year of potable water savings of 60% or more

Climate Bills

- H.R. 2454 (Waxman-Markey) passed by Congress in June, 2009
- S. 1733 (Boxer-Kerry) proposed 9/30
- Incorporates S. 1712 provisions:
 - Authorizes EPA's WaterSense program
 - Directs Federal agencies to purchase WaterSense or Federal Energy Management Program certified products
 - Authorizes grants to eligible entities for incentive programs to consumers who purchase and install water-efficient products



Green Infrastructure

- H.R. 4202 (Edwards) introduced 12/3/2009
- Establishes centers of excellence for green infrastructure throughout the United States in a competitive grant process
- Creates within the EPA's Office of Water a green infrastructure program to coordinate, promote and integrate green infrastructure into permitting programs




Consumer Incentives

- WaterSense indoor and outdoor measures, New Homes
- Incentive funds allocated to states by population formula
- S. 1712: \$700 million over 5 years
- H.R. 2368: \$450 million over 5 years
- NOTE: H.R. 2368 amended into H.R. 2454 (House Climate bill) and passed in June, 2009



Home Star Proposal

- S. 363 "Clean Energy Jobs and Oil Accountability Act of 2010"
- Next "jobs/incentives" legislation
- \$500 Billion for energy ,\$100 million for water
- May move in the last days of Congress after elections
- Senator Reid committed to bringing bill to floor



Home Star Water Provisions

Silver Star water provisions:

- 50% rebate on WaterSense products
- Indoor as well as outdoor products
- 50% of installation costs would be covered
- Maximum of \$150 per WaterSense product, total rebates not to exceed \$750
- Maximum of \$300 per installation, total services not to exceed \$1500

Gold Star water provisions:

\$500 rebate for 20% reduction in potable water use



Legislative Strategy

- Paintball approach
- We had hoped for something to pass in this Congress
- Water and energy efficiency getting intertwined at last
- Energy Efficiency, Carbon credits and climate change
- WaterSense getting Congressional interest
- WATER Coalition closely working with Congress


