





TEMPORARY WATER RESTRICTIONS NOW IN PLACE

Cucamonga Valley Water District has adopted a "Stage 2 Water Supply Alert," which includes the following temporary conservation

- Outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes and turf limited to the hours between 4:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. unless reclaimed water is used
- or excessive irrigation
- Automobiles may only be washed using hoses with automatic shutoff nozzles
- be hosed down

Restaurants and hotels are doing their part by serving water only upon request and offering the option of not laundering linen daily




