Rain Capture Program – Rain Barrels

- Our first rain capture program
- Introduced in September 2013
- As a \$500k pilot program
- \$75 rebate
- 4 rain barrels per home
- "Gateway Rebate?"



Rain Capture Program - FULL



By May 2014

- Only 7 months from implementation
- Over 6,500 RB rebates
- About 95% budget
- Request move from pilot permanent program



Regional Rebate Program



- At May 2014 Board
- Authorize to have Rain
 Barrels in our Regional
 Rebate Program
- Part of our overall budget



2015 Modifications to the Program

PAC Recommends:

- Add Cisterns to the Program
- Cisterns: at least 200 gallons
- Rebate for cisterns: \$300/unit (regardless of size)
- Board approves November 2015




Rain Capture Just 2 Years from Launch



As of 7/2016

- ~ 100,000 Rain Barrels
- @ \$75 = \$7.5M
- "Gateway Analysis?"
 - 7% of customers requested rebates for other devices








Monthly Rain Barrel Activity


Rain Barrel Customer Survey



- October of 2016 conducted online survey
- 44,000 paid rebate applications
- Survey sent to 2,500 rain barrel customers
- 843 responses






