#### Resource Central

Our Mission: Putting conservation into action

Our History: 501(c)(3) nonprofit social enterprise; founded in 1976 by a group of citizens concerned about our dependence on non-renewable resources

## Water Programs

- Program areas: Landscape Change, Turf Removal, Toilet Upgrades, Indoor/Outdoor Audits, Education
- 40 utility partners
- 5,000 customer interactions per year
- Over 300 million gallons of expected lifetime savings from 2018 programs

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# Flush for the Future Overview

- Two models in one:
  - Cost Share
    - Partially subsidized by the utility
    - Participants have two options to receive the toilet
      - Self-install for \$75
      - Technician install for \$175
  - Income Qualified
    - Utilities cover the entire cost
    - Participants are pre-approved through bill assistance program
    - Includes installation by our technicians

# Flush for the Future Overview

- Use Niagara Stealth toilet
  - Only 0.8 gallons per flush!
  - 92% satisfaction rate among our customers
- Customers fill out an application online to ensure eligibility
  - Receive water from a participating utility
  - Have not already participated
  - Replacing a toilet with more than 1.28 GPF
  - Select a size that will fit their bathroom

# Flush for the Future: Impact

2017 at a glance

- 774 toilets distributed in 2017
- Estimated total annual savings of 5.8 million gallons
- Estimated lifetime savings of 179 million gallons
- Since 2013, over 2,000 toilets distributed with lifetime savings of 539 million gallons of water



# Flush for the Future: Why Income

Qualified?

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### Cities Want to Help Those in Need

- Cities are creating assistance programs to help low income residents
  - This includes water bill assistance
- If a resident qualifies, they can receive bill assistance or free water entirely
- Can save residents hundreds, and even thousands of dollars per year

# Short-Term Assistance

Many programs are term limited

Then, residents go back to paying their full bills

 How to maintain cost savings on water bills after bill assistance ends?

#### Toilets Are One Answer

- Simple, immediate, and long-lasting water savings with no behavior change necessary
- Estimated savings of nearly 8,000 gallons per year (Based on Resource Central statistics)
- Using Thornton's current water rates, that's a savings of over \$1,200 over the life of the toilet
  - Assuming the lowest tier of usage and no rate increase
- Helps to lower costs long after participation in bill assistance program ends, but...

## Toilets Aren't Cheap

- The Stealth retails for \$165-\$190
- Installation is additional expense
- Bottom line: toilets are very effective water savers but aren't affordable for everyone.

# Flush for the Future to the Rescue

- Simple alternative to rebates
- We provide:
  - All customer service
  - Scheduling and completion of installations
  - Impact tracking
  - Customer satisfaction surveys
  - Recycling of the old toilets
- Saves utilities time, resources, and staff
- Easy for both utilities and customers

## IQ Impact to Date

- Began the IQ program in 2015
- Since then, we've installed 290 toilets in IQ homes in two cities
- Total estimated lifetime savings of 67 million gallons
- Total estimated savings of \$363,312 passed on to participants




# Flush for the Future:

Feedback and Lessons Learned

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## Customer Survey Feedback



- 93% satisfaction with the installation and the toilet itself
- 94% believe the program is a good use of their utility's resources
- 80% would not have changed their toilet without this program

### Customer Quotes

- "I am so happy with it and appreciated them taking the old toilet away."
- "I would have paid a little, but it would have been a hardship. I would have just tried to fix my old one that ran and didn't fill well."
- "Very low income grateful for the opportunity to upgrade to this toilet!"

#### Lessons Learned

- Pre-existing issues preventing installation
  - Flange is absent or broken (86% of issues)
  - Flooring issue (14% of issues)
- 14% of installations, problem identified immediately and toilet is not removed
- 24% of installations, toilet is removed then a problem is found
  - Often leaves residents with no toilet and expensive repairs

## Mitigating Challenges

- Programs available to assist with cost of repairs
  - Even with assistance, repairs can take weeks to complete
- Now a requirement that utility partners have some program available that participants would automatically qualify for
- Working on a plan to develop partnerships with local plumbers and carpenters to provide repairs in more timely manner
- Train our technicians to repair and install flange



### Conclusion

- High-efficiency toilet upgrades are a simple and effective way to guarantee water savings and cut costs for lowincome residents.
- Without such a program, most residents would not replace their toilet, leaving a lot of water savings on the table.
- Successful toilet installations are not guaranteed so a plan must be in place to quickly fix any underlying issues and ensure the toilet can be installed.

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
