

Meetings

- Type of Meetings
- Keep Meetings Moving
 - Ground Rules
 - Purposeful Agenda
 - Communicate Outcomes

- Common Ground Rules for Meetings
 - Stay focused on task and adhere to any time limits.
 - 2. Participate, share information, and invite questions.
 - Be specific (e.g. use examples).
 - Signal desire to speak and wait for turn.
 - 5. Don't speak while others are speaking.
 - 6. Agree on what important words mean.
 - 7. Focus on interests, not positions.
 - 8. Disagree and debate openly.
 - 9. Respect those who disagree.
 - 10. Listen actively.

 - Strive for Consensus
 - Tabling Items

- Required to meet at least once per quarter
 - Open public meetings










WCAC Membership

 - Each appointed member selects their own designated alternate.




