





MWD's Long Push for Turf Replacement

- Largest turf removal program in the country
 - 183.2 million square feet removed
 - 741,800 acre feet of water savings
- Changes made to add sustainability to water savings
- Turf replacement program
 - Stormwater features
 - Plant coverage requirements
 - Permeable hardscape

Transformation = Water Savings?

- Water savings calculations based on garden "lifetime"
 - 10-30 years of lifetime water savings
 - Irrigation changes are key
- Additional savings calculated from "spillover" effect
 - Increase in public demonstration gardens
 - Direct install neighborhood demonstration gardens

Maintenance - the missing resource

- Poorly maintained landscapes counteract program goals
 - Discourage neighbors
 - Shorten landscape life
- Different roles of landscape contractors
 - Installation contractors
 - Maintenance contractors
 - "Mow and Blow"
 - Water efficient landscape experts
- Maintenance resources targeted towards homeowners

Landscape Contractor Training

- Desire to fill the gap in turf replacement projects
 - What is most important in garden maintenance?
 - What elements should we include?
- Certification training designed for landscape contractors
 - Sonoma-Marin Water Saving Partnership Qualified Water Efficient Landscaper (QWEL)
 - CLCA Water Management Certification
 - Green Gardens Group Watershed Wise Landscape Professional Certification

Why combine these certifications?

- Both EPA WaterSense Certified
 - Inclusion in WaterSense directory
 - Work opportunities for federal projects
- Similar content and field audit requirement
- Target audience
 - MWD able to offset high cost of CLCA certification training for public agency staff
 - Able to leverage CLCA connections and member list to fill QWEL classes
- Board and staff crossover

QWEL/CLCA Combined Program

- One 20+ hour workshop
 - Field audit
 - Content from both programs
- Single final exam



- Water management assistance
- Benefit of two certifications from one workshop
 - Listed on QWEL, CLCA, and MWD websites



A Great Start


- 131 individuals completed 18-hour virtual class sessions
